

SDSO 2022-23 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

The 2022-23 season was the dawn of the SDSO's second century. Heralded as "the model of an engaged orchestra," highlights of the SDSO's community-centric approach this season include the release of its first-ever recording, **LAKOTA MUSIC PROJECT**, a sold-out performance of **BEETHOVEN'S SYMPHONY NO. 9** featuring the four public high school choirs from Sioux Falls, and a standingroom only post-concert talk following a triumphant performance of **SHOSTAKOVICH'S SYMPHONY NO. 7**.

Community impact like this drew the attention of Rosemarie and Dean Buntrock who made the largest donation in the orchestra's history of **\$2 MILLION**.





SDSO'S FIRST Commercial recording

South Dakota Symphony Orchestra proudly released its first commercial recording, "Lakota Music Project," on the American Composers Forum label Innova on October 28, 2022. The result of years of collaboration between Maestro Delta David Gier, the SDSO, and its American Indian partners, the recording features works by Brent Michael Davids, Jeffrey Paul, Jerod Impichchaachaaha' Tate, and Theodore Wiprud, with performances by the SDSO with Lakota drumming group The Creekside Singers and Dakota cedar flutist Bryan Akipa. The CD design by Laurie Bertrand features the Oscar Howe painting "Flute Player," used with kind permission from the Oscar Howe family. The audio producer was Peter Folliard and the executive producer was Delta David Gier. The CD and digital recordings are available to purchase online at amazon.com, and the recording can be streamed on most popular streaming platforms.

MUSIC COMPOSITION ACADEMIES 2022

The Music Composition Academies are two admission-free, week-long composition summer camps serving primarily Native American middle and high school students on both the Western and Eastern sides of South Dakota. At the end of the week, each student creates their own composition for either string quartet or woodwind quintet. The camps are always tuition free, with lodging and food provided, to keep the program accessible to students.

Compositions were performed in the students' communities and in school performances in Rosholt, Rapid City, Oelrichs, and Sisseton. All twenty original pieces were showcased at the SDPB studios in Sioux Falls on February 1st, 2023.



SOUTH DAKOTA SYMPHONY YOUTH ORCHESTRA (SDSYO)

The South Dakota Symphony Youth Orchestra is an elite music education program comprised of four student orchestras and a chamber music program for beginning students to a symphonic orchestra for advanced players, and a chamber orchestra for student musicians ages 6 – 18. These ensembles provide an inspiring group setting that gives young musicians the tools and training to pursue artistic passions, develop musical talents, and build leadership skills. Performances are scheduled at major venues throughout each season, giving students multiple opportunities to showcase their musical talents.

In addition to the SDSYO's three annual perfromances, members of the Youth Orchestra play alongside their SDSO professional counterparts each year in a "side-by-side" concert on the Mary W. Sommervold stage.




KANSAS CITY TOUR 2023

In June, the South Dakota Symphony Youth Orchestra traveled to Kansas City for its first performance outside of South Dakota. This tour combined social and sightseeing activities with a full performance of Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5. Students had the opportunity to sample famous Kansas City BBQ and learn about the development and influence of jazz on the region at the American Jazz Museum. Dr. Silas Huff, the Director of Orchestras at Washburn University conducted the YO in a clinic-rehearsal hybrid. The YO performance at the Medallion Theater featured Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5 and Finlandia by Jean Sibelius, joined by local choristers from the Kansas City area. Among the highlights of the tour was attending a concert at the Kansas City Symphony featuring Mahler's Symphony No. 4 and music by composer Jessie Montgomery and soprano Julia Bullock, both of whom boarded the Youth Orchestra bus after the concert to say hello to the students! The opportunity to perform in a new state with guest artists and experience the cultural and artistic diversity in Kansas City was monumental for our students and paves the way for future tours and related endeavors.


2022-23 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS / REVENUE
