Organization Description:

The South Dakota Symphony Orchestra (SDSO) is based in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, a vibrant and growing community serving a 125-mile region that touches 5 states. Over the past several years, the orchestra has seen significant growth in its musical prowess and the scope of products and services. Known for innovative programming and state-wide outreach, the SDSO has a strong heritage upon which to build an even stronger future. The SDSO is the region's premiere arts organization with the Washington Pavilion as its home.
